

GOOD TO KNOW TO TRAVEL TO OUR REGION

What is important when entering Austria?

Entry into Austria is no longer subject to any regulations.

Do guests need to show a certificate at the accommodation?

No certificate is necessary at the accommodation.

Is there a possibility in the region to get Corona tests?

PCR gargle tests in Tyrol:

Prior online registration is required in order to obtain a test. Tests are available for collection from Spar and MPreis supermarkets. Registration is via www.tirol.gv.at/tirolgurgelt. Each (registered) person with a residence address (i.e. holiday accommodation address) in Tyrol can get 5 PCR gargle tests per month free of charge. Only one test per person can be carried out within a 24-hour period. The PCR gargle test collection and return stations are located by the check-out areas in the supermarkets and tests will be collected for evaluation once daily from all locations. What happens if I develop symptoms and/or test positive during my stay?

If you suspect you have Covid-19, you will be asked to stay in your room until the local health authority (tel. 1450) or the local doctor can be informed, the district health authority has been notified and the responsible doctor has arrived on site. You cannot leave the room before the test results have been received, unless you need to be transferred to hospital. All contact persons from 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms should be contacted as quickly as possible. The quarantine in the room will end in the event of a negative test result (PCR test) and no further steps are required in resort.

In the event of a positive test result (PCR test), you must remain in the room until the health authorities have been informed and further instructions have been received. There are different possibilities here: quarantine in the accommodation, quarantine in a so-called 'safe house' or, in extreme cases, transfer to hospital. An early return home for the positive-tested person is also possible under certain conditions. This is done by means of a special 'infection transport' and must be considered and approved on an individual basis by the authorities.

What happens if another guest in the property tests positive?

You are not regarded as a contact person if you have already 3 vaccinations or if you have worn an FFP2 mask during contact with the other guest (also valid for unvaccinated children).

What rules apply in shops and with service providers?

The wearing of an FFP2 mask is not mandatory anymore.

Are there contact restrictions?

There are no general contact or going-out restrictions.

Where and when do I have to wear an FFP2 mask?

An FFP2-mask is currently compulsory in hospitals as well as retirement and nursing homes. Exceptions include persons exempt from wearing a mask for medical reasons and children up to the age of 6. Children between 6 and 14 years are allowed to wear a simple mouth-nose protective mask.

What is important on departure?

PCR gargle tests in Tyrol:

Please note the validity of the tests, as requirements may differ depending on individual countries –[Travel Information European Commission](#).

Return travel restrictions depend on the country of origin:

Re-entry for Austrian guests: no restrictions for returning elsewhere in Austria from our region.

Re-entry to Switzerland: to return to Switzerland there aren't any requirements

Re-entry to Germany: to return to Germany there aren't any requirements.

Re-entry to Italy: entry or re-entry to Italy is only possible with a vaccination pass (fully-vaccinated min. 14 days and with an EMA-approved vaccine) or a proof of recovery certificate (required quarantine period must be over) or a test certificate (negative PCR not older than 72 hours or antigen test not older than 48 hours at the time of entry/re-entry, also applies to children over the age of 6 years).

Certificates must be in Italian, English, French or Spanish and can be digital or in paper-form (certificates in German are also acceptable for South Tyrol).
